

## GARDEN PERENNIALS

### Daylily, Tawny

*Hemerocallis fulva*

**Grandma's favorite!** This old-time daylily produces huge quantities of orange flowers which bloom for up to 1-1/2 months in midsummer. Spreads slowly to form a small colony. These were early imports from England to 17th century American gardens and soon established themselves. Sometimes called Roadside or Railroad Daylily, and gained the nickname Wash-house or Out-house Lily because it was frequently planted at such buildings. Tolerates full sun to partial shade. Could be used for bank stabilization. Absolutely hardy!
